Green is a good look for you, Interstate

Volunteers will plant trees Saturday to beautify Eugene highway, absorb pollution

Who: Approximately 100 volunteers organized by Friends of Trees, including University of

Oregon students and employees from sponsors Mountain Rose Herbs and REI, in

partnership with the Oregon Department of Transportation.

What: Planting 180 native trees and shrubs to beautify Interstate 105/Highway 126 and absorb

pollution.

When: Saturday, April 18, 8:45 a.m. – 1 p.m.

Where: 52nd Street and Interstate 105/Highway 126 in Eugene (map)

Why: Trees absorb as much as 50 percent of particulate matter emitted by cars, and they also

beautify highways, absorb noise, and slow down traffic. This is Friends of Trees' fourth highway planting in the Eugene-Springfield area in partnership with ODOT, which owns

the land.
