YOUTH VOLUNTEERS

QUESTIONS + ANSWERS

In order to participate, all youth under age 18 must bring to the event a waiver pre-signed by their parent or legal guardian.

Does a parent or guardian need to be present?

For youth age 15 and younger, we kindly request a parent or guardian is in attendance. We kindly ask that there is 1 adult for every 5 youth as staff supervision is limited at events.

Is there a minimum age for planters?

We love the enthusiasm to build tree and community stewardship young, and, over time, we have received feedback from parents that our events are best suited for the following age groups:

Younger than 6? Given the physical nature of the work and the weather conditions that we plant in, our events can be challenging for children younger than 6 and the adults who look after them. Families with small children are more than welcome at our events, but we recommend one adult supervisor for each child under the age of 6.

Ages 6+: Our Green Space (GS) events are great for planters as young as 6 years old. These events take place at a single location and have a variety of tasks for our smaller planters. Plants are small and easily handled by younger planters.

Ages 10+: Our Neighborhood Trees (NT) events are more appropriate for children 10 years of age or older. At our NT events each crew plants along busy neighborhood streets, traveling to several different houses (planting sites) throughout the neighborhood, planting 8-10 large-stock trees weighing about 50lbs each. Youth under 10 (and the adults looking after them) may find these events challenging.

What to wear?

Our planting season runs from October through April, when trees are dormant and the abundant rain helps them get firmly established. The weather can often be cold and rainy. The fall and winter mornings can be chilly, after an hour of planting you may get warm, so we recommend that you dress in layers. Waterproof outerwear is ideal. For safety reasons, we require you wear sturdy, closed-toe shoes or boots. Tall rubber rain boots are the best.

Of course, you'll be digging in soil and handling mulch, so please wear clothes that you don't mind getting dirty.

Friends of Trees provides gloves to wear for the event.



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
